NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Metropolitan King County Council (Council) will hold a public hearing on the King County Comprehensive Plan (KCCP) at the King County Convention Center in Seattle, WA on Monday, October 29, 2018, between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. This public hearing is to consider adoption of Planning Ordinance P50-0152-2 (hereinafter "Ordinance P50-0152-2"), which would adopt the 2018 comprehensive plan (KCCP), King County Comprehensive Plan (KCCP).

Public Hearing: King County encourages public comment of the October 29 public hearing. "Tactical comments" may be submitted during the public hearing. If you wish to submit written comments, please provide 20 copies to the King County Office of Planning and Environment, 316 Third Avenue, Seattle, WA 98101. Written comments may also be submitted via email to KingCountyPlanning@kingcounty.gov. Written comments may also be submitted online at www.kingcounty.gov/planning/. Summary: The KCCP is the guiding policy document for all land use and development decisions made by the County. It is a long-term vision for such countywide residential services or areas as housing, transportation, energy, economy, parks, trails and open space. The KCCP is required by state Growth Management Act (GMA).

Proposed 2018 amendments to the 2014 KCCP were adopted by the King County Executive on March 1, 2018, and reported by the Council Planning, Environment, and Sustainability (PES) Committee. The Council's PES Committee, and its subcommittees, the Regional Planning Commission, which included the community for tribal liaison, received the proposed 2018 amendments. Public comments were also received via e-mail, postcard, and telephone. The public hearing was held on September 12, 2018 and reported to the PES Council the subject legislation.

The PES includes these overarching substantive changes to the 2014 KCCP:

- New comprehensive planning schedule: a staggered timeline includes alignment with GMA updates, countywide documents, more modest mid-point updates of local plans, and a focus on alignment in an annual scope of work, and annual updates to the Comprehensive Plan Service Area (CPA) subarea plan, such as:

- Shift from a March to December Council review cycle to a June to June Council review timeframe.

- Authorization for c. 2020 KCCP update, with the intent to align the proposed timeline of the revision, specifying the scope of work, and the date of the first public hearing on the 2020 update.

- Adoption of a new CPA subarea plan for the CPA subareas planning to reflect modified development and Council review that will have a CPA subarea plan.

- Increased funding requirements for several Workplan action items;

- Addition of three new Workplan action items.

The proposed 2018 KCCP amendments, contained in Attachment B to P50-0152-2, as reported out of the PES Committee, were referred to the members of the KCCP. Cover Letter, Executive Order, Chapter 1: Regional Growth Commissioners, Chapter 2: Water Resources and Floodplain Management, Chapter 3: Transportation, Chapter 12: Economic Development, Chapter 13: Land Use Services Area Planning, Chapter 14: Implementation, Monitoring and Evaluation; and the Glossary.

The proposed 2018 KCCP amendments to the 2014 KCCP, contained in Attachment B to P50-0152-2, as reported out of the PES Committee, were referred to the members of the Subarea Plan: Chapter II: Implementation.

Proposal changes to the development code are also included in P50-0152-2.

Final hearing: The Council will review the subject legislation as recommended by the Council's PES Committee. The Council may offer amendments to final legislation for consideration. The Council may also consider options articulated in any of the issues raised during the public hearing, and make their views known of the subject legislation. Any amendments that may be considered by the Council on October 29 or thereafter include the following:

- Specific amendments defined in the agenda for the public hearing;
- Technical skills and expertise required for the second update scope of work, Alignment, Unitary Development Document, CPA Subarea Planning, Schedules, and Amendments to the 2014 KCCP;

- Any comments contained in the Executive's transmitted version of the subject legislation;

- Any amendment offered or issued by Council or the PES Committee that is within the scope of the alternatives and has been considered by public comment.
