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1	AN ORDINANCE accepting and approving the Medic
2	One/Emergency Medical Services 2020-2025 Strategic
3	Plan submitted by the executive.
4	PREAMBLE:
5	Emergency medical services are among the most important services
6	provided to county residents. Those services include basic and advanced
7	life support, regional medical control and quality improvement,
8	emergency medical technician training, emergency medical dispatch
9	training, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and defibrillation training,
10	paramedic continuing education, injury prevention education and related
11	services. In combination, those services have made the emergency
12	medical services network in King County an invaluable lifesaving effort
13	and an important part of the quality of life standards afforded residents of
14	the county.
15	The Medic One/emergency medical services system in King County is
16	recognized as one of the best emergency medical services program in the
17	country. With an international reputation for innovation and excellence, it
18	offers uniform medical care regardless of location, incident circumstances,

19	day of the week or time of day.
20	The King County regional system has among the finest of medical
21	outcomes in the world for out-of-hospital cardiac arrest. In 2017, the
22	system achieved a fifty-six-percent survival rate for cardiac arrest, which
23	is among the highest-reported rates in the nation. Compared to other
24	communities, Seattle and King County cardiac arrest victims are two to
25	three times more likely to survive.
26	The system's success can be traced to its unique design that is built upon
27	the following components:
28	1. Regional, collaborative, crossjurisdictional and coordinated
29	partnerships that allow for "seamless" operations;
30	2. Emergency medical services that are derived from the highest
31	standards of medical training, practices and care, scientific evidence and
32	close supervision by physicians experienced in emergency medical
33	services care;
34	3. Programmatic leadership and state-of-the-art science-based strategies
35	that allow the system to obtain superior medical outcomes and meet its
36	own needs and expectations, as well as of those of its residents;
37	4. Sustained regional focus on operational and financial efficiencies that
38	have led to the system's financial viability and stability, even throughout
39	the economic recession; and
40	5. Stable funding by a voter approved levy that makes the services it
41	provides less vulnerable, though not immune, to fluctuations in the

42 economy. King County should continue to exercise leadership and assume 43 44 responsibility for assuring the consistent, standardized, effective and cost efficient development and provision of emergency services throughout the 45 46 county. 47 The emergency medical services advisory task force was developed via Executive Order PHL - 9-1 - EO for "developing interjurisdictional 48 49 agreement on an emergency medical services strategic plan and financing 50 package for the 2020-2025 levy funding period, as well as implementing 51 and reviewing programs and studies as directed by the adopted strategic plan." 52 53 Beginning in January 2018, the emergency medical services advisory task 54 force worked collaboratively with emergency medical services stakeholders to review system needs and regional priorities, and develop 55 56 programmatic and financial recommendations that ensure the integrity of 57 the world-class Medic One/emergency medical services system is 58 maintained. On September 18, 2018, the emergency medical services advisory task force endorsed its Programmatic Needs Recommendations, 59 which became the foundation of the Medic One/Emergency Medical 60 61 Services 2020-2025 Strategic Plan. 62 The Medic One/Emergency Medical Services 2020-2025 Strategic Plan 63 outlines how the region will execute the operational and financial 64 recommendations that the emergency medical services advisory task force

65	endorsed on September 18, 2018. It is the primary policy and financial
66	document that directs the emergency medical services network into the
67	future.
68	The policies embedded within the Medic One/Emergency Medical
69	Services 2020-2025 Strategic Plan ensure that the emergency medical
70	services system serving Seattle and King County: remains an adequately
71	funded, regional tiered system; reflects the existing successful medical
72	model; and continues to provide state of the art science-based strategies,
73	programs and leadership.
74	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
75	SECTION 1. The council hereby accepts and approves the Medic
76	One/Emergency Medical Services 2020-2025 Strategic Plan, dated March 2019, which is
77	Attachment A to this ordinance. The recommendations contained in the Medic
78	One/Emergency Medical Services 2020-2025 Strategic Plan shall inform and update the
79	provision of emergency medical services throughout King County during the 2020-2025
80	time span.
