Proposed No. 2007-0401.1 Sponsors Phillips 1 A MOTION requesting the King County executive and 2 department of natural resources and parks assess and report 3 on public education activities recommended to be 4 coordinated with the state Department of Ecology and local 5 jurisdictions to implement state-issued phase I and phase II 6 stormwater permits. 7 8 WHEREAS, the United States Congress passed the 1972 Clean Water Act to set a 9 national standard protecting all the nation's waters, and 10 WHEREAS, polluted stormwater from runoff is a major threat to Puget Sound 11 and to the state's and King County's urban waters, and 12 WHEREAS, municipal stormwater permits are required by the federal Clean 13 Water Act and are delegated to states to administer, and the state of Washington has just 14 issued phase I and phase II permits to King County and its cities, and 15 WHEREAS, public outreach and education are a key components of the efforts at 16 the state and local level to manage and control the point sources of pollution that may 17 come from domestic, commercial and industrial functions and facilities, and

WHEREAS, efforts to educate the general public regarding activities as simple as
car washing, disposal of household waste and landscaping to inform them of best
management practices can provide significant benefits particularly when multiplied over
the number of households in King County, and
WHEREAS, best management practices related to car washing are already known
and have been shown to be effective in reducing the pollution and harmful surfactants
affecting human, plant, fish and other species as they are released to local streams, lakes
and other waterways via stormwater, and
WHEREAS, the activities and means to coordinate such messages regarding use
of commercial car washing facilities, washing cars on gravel, grass or other permeable

WHEREAS, the activities and means to coordinate such messages regarding use of commercial car washing facilities, washing cars on gravel, grass or other permeable surfaces and utilizing car wash kits and block off storm drains during car wash events have been shown to be practical and beneficial;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

- A. The executive and department of natural resources and parks are requested to assess and report on public education activities recommended to be coordinated with the state Department of Ecology and local jurisdictions to implement state-issued phase I and phase II stormwater permits;
- B. The executive and department of natural resources and parks are requested to in particular work with local jurisdictions to evaluate public education opportunities and explore potential incentives and disincentives for adhering to best management practices for domestic and commercial car washing activities and provide recommendations to the

council regarding coordination and consistency in public education around these activities.
