Request for Proposal (RFP) Veterans & Human Service Levy Funds Available for Prevention and Early Intervention Programs to Strengthen Families

The Martin Luther King County Children and Family Commission (CFC) on behalf of the Veterans & Human Service Levy Oversight Board is pleased to announce the availability of prevention/early intervention funding for strengthening families at risk in King County. Funds will be distributed through a competitive request for proposal (RFP) to enhance and/or expand current evidence-based and promising practice programs.

Family Focus

The focus of these funds will be to strengthen King County families with young children—primarily under the age of five—who live in environments where stressors are particularly high. Examples include families who are living in poverty, families of active duty, Guard and Reservists that have/are/will serve our country, families where one or both parents are unemployed or under-employed, families with domestic violence involvement, families experiencing homelessness, and families struggling with substance abuse or mental health problems. Additionally, for some families, limited English proficiency or being new immigrants/refugees can lead to stresses that interfere with healthy child development.

Investment Areas

The document guiding the RFP: The Veterans and Human Services Levy Procurement Plan: Strengthening Families at Risk – Prevention and Early Intervention Programs (procurement plan) calls for the funding of a framework of programs built around strategies that promote an integrative approach that increases the protective factors related to strong families while reducing family risks and deficits. The procurement plan calls for investments in three areas to strengthen families:

- Home visiting programs to support the healthy interactions between parent and child in the
 early months and years of life. Research has shown the link between these programs and
 the prevention of child abuse and neglect and later prevention of a child's involvement in the
 criminal justice system.
- Training for caregivers and staff that work with high risk children under the age of five and their families. Training in evidence-based curricula has been shown to improve staff skills and help create high quality environments in which children and families learn and grow.
- Improving access to services for immigrants/refugees new to this country who are experiencing language and cultural isolation.

Building on Current Success

Following the guidance of the procurement plan, the RFP seeks to build on the success of existing evidence-based and promising practice programs in the community. Applications for new programs will not be accepted.

The RFP will solicit proposals from contractors that can demonstrate the ability to achieve the desired outcomes for each investment area outlined in the procurement plan. All applicants will be required to demonstrate their capacity to enhance and/or expand their existing evidence-based or promising practice program with fidelity, demonstrate how they will provide culturally competent services, conduct community based outreach and marketing of the program, work with Levy evaluators, and meet other selection criteria.

Funds Available

\$521,593 total per year available January 2008, allocated to the three investment areas:

- Home Visiting \$270,000.
- Training--\$94,000 dedicated for implementation of evidence-based and promising practice curriculum programs. \$82,593 dedicated for community programs that serve children from high risk families to be trained in the curriculum selected.
- Access—\$75,000.
