1	AN ORDINANCE related to levy-related funds; amending
2	Ordinance 14793, Section 2, and K.C.C. 4.08.082 and
3	Ordinance 12076, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C.
4	4.08.015 and adding a new section to K.C.C. chapter 4.08.
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6	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
7	SECTION 1. Ordinance 14793, Section 2, and K.C.C. 4.08.082 are each hereby
8	amended to read as follows:
9	A. There is hereby created the parks and recreation fund, classified as a special
10	revenue fund, for the purpose of accounting for the following:
11	1. The proceeds of the property tax levy approved by the voters of King Count
12	on May 20, 2003, under Ordinance 14586, in excess of the levy limitation contained in
13	chapter 84.55 RCW and other revenue for the park and recreation purposes outlined in
14	subsection A.1.a. and b. of this section. ((This)) The four-year levy commencing in 200
15	has been approved by the voters for paying costs associated with the following eligible
16	purposes of:

17	((1.)) <u>a.</u> The continued and increased operation and maintenance of King
18	County's regional and rural parks; and
19	((2.)) <u>b.</u> Up to three hundred thousand dollars of annual funding for recreation
20	grant programs, as prescribed in Ordinance 14586((, which submitted the levy to the
21	voters.));
22	2. The proceeds of the property tax levy approved by the voters of King County
23	on August 21, 2007, under Ordinance 15759, in excess of the levy limitation contained in
24	chapter 84.55 RCW and other revenue for the park and recreation purposes outlined in
25	subsection A.2. a., b. and c. of this section. In accordance with Ordinance 15759, Section
26	4, the levy proceeds shall be deposited in a levy subfund of the parks and recreation fund,
27	or its successor. The six-year levy commencing in 2008 was approved by the voters for
28	paying costs associated with the following eligible purposes:
29	a. The continued and increased operations and maintenance of King County's
30	regional and rural parks;
31	b. Program improvements to provide increased accessibility for the disabled;
32	and
33	c. To provide up to three hundred thousand dollars annually for recreation
34	grant programs;
35	3. The proceeds of the property tax levy approved by the voters of King County
36	on August 21, 2007, under Ordinance 15760, in excess of the levy limitation contained in
37	chapter 84.55 RCW. Of the proceeds designated for distribution to King County cities
38	and the zoo, a reasonable portion shall be retained by the county to be used for
39	expenditures related to administration of the distribution of levy proceeds. In accordance

40	with Ordinance 15760, Section 4, the proceeds of the six year property tax levy shall be
41	deposited in a dedicated subfund of the parks and recreation fund, or its successor. The
42	six-year levy commencing in 2008 has been approved by the voters for paying costs
43	associated with the following eligible purposes as follows.
44	a. sixty percent for King County's acquisition of open space and natural lands
45	critical to the preservation of regional watersheds and streams, for acquisition and
46	development of rights of way for regional trails, with primary consideration given to
47	those projects that address health disparities/health inequities as recognized in the Health
48	of King County 2006 report and are consistent with the Regional Trails Plan including
49	acquisition of missing critical links and/or maximization of regional trail use, and for
50	repayment of costs, including principal and interest, associated with interim financing
51	following approval of the levy, and to provide up to five hundred thousand dollars
52	annually for capital funding of recreation grant programs. The moneys to be used for the
53	purposes of this subsection A.1.a. shall be deposited in the parks capital fund created
54	under section 2 of this section;
55	b. twenty percent for distribution to cities in King County of which fifty
56	percent shall be distributed based on city population, and of which fifty percent shall be
57	distributed based on the assessed value of parcels within a city for city projects; and
58	c. twenty percent for Woodland Park Zoo projects; and
59	4. Any annual transfer from the current expense fund and other revenue to
60	support the costs of operating local parks in the Urban Growth Area.
61	B. ((In accordance with Ordinance 14586, Section 4, the proceeds of the four-
62	year parks property tax levy shall be deposited in the parks and recreation fund. The

63	expenditures required to maintain the county's parks and recreation facilities shall be
64	budgeted and accounted for in the parks and recreation fund commencing with the 2004
65	budget.
66	C. In addition to the levy proceeds, other revenues required to support these
67	expenditures shall be deposited in the parks and recreation fund, including parks system-
68	generated revenues as well as any annual transfer from the current expense fund to
69	support the costs of operating local parks in the Urban Growth Area.)) The fund shall be
70	managed in such a way as to distinguish levy revenues, business revenues and current
71	expense revenues, as well as regional and rural operating expenditures, community grant
72	program expenditures and Urban Growth Area expenditures.
73	((D)) <u>C</u> . The department of natural resources and parks shall be the fund
74	manager for the parks and recreation fund.
75	$((\underline{E}.))$ <u>D</u> . For investment purposes, the parks and recreation fund shall be
76	considered a first tier fund.
77	NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. There is hereby added to K.C.C. chapter 4.08 a
78	new section to read as follows:
79	A. There is hereby created the parks capital fund, classified as a capital fund, for
80	the purpose of budgeting the King County portion of the proceeds of the property tax
81	levy deposited in the fund in accordance with K.C.C. 4.08.082.A.3.a., for the purposes
82	described in subsection B. of this section and other moneys for capital parks and
83	recreation purposes.
84	B. 1. The levy moneys in the fund shall be used for any of the following eligible
85	purposes: King County's acquisition of open space and natural lands critical to the

86	preservation of regional watersheds and streams, for acquisition and development of				
87	rights of way for regional trails, with primary consideration given to those projects that				
88	address health disparities and health inequities as recognized in the Health of King				
89	County 2006 report and are consistent with the Regional Trails Plan including acquisition				
90	of missing critical links and/or maximization of regional trail use, and for repayment of				
91	costs, including principal and interest, associated with interim financing following				
92	approval of the levy, and to provide up to five hundred thousand dollars annually for				
93	capital funding of recreation grant programs.				
94	2. Any other moneys deposited in the fund shall be used for capital parks and				
95	recreation purposes.				
96	C. The moneys in the fund from the levy approved under Ordinance 15760 shall				
97	be used solely for the designated purposes and shall not supplant existing funds used for				
98	those purposes.				
99	D. The fund shall be managed in such a way as to distinguish levy revenues from				
100	any other revenues in the fund.				
101	E. The department of natural resources and parks shall be the fund manager for				
102	the fund.				
103	F. For investment purposes, the parks capital expansion fund shall be considered				
104	a first tier fund.				
105	SECTION 3. Ordinance 12076, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.08.015 are				
106	each hereby amended to read as follows:

113	resources and parks shall be the fund manager for utility-related funds.					
114	2. All county funds that receive original proceeds of borrowings made under					
115	Chapter 216, Washington Laws of 1982, as now existing or hereafter amended, to the					
116	extent of	the amounts then outstanding	for the borrowings for that fund. For purposes of			
117	this subse	ection, the director of the count	y department or office primarily responsible for			
118	expenditures from that fund shall be the fund manager.
