#### **SUMMARY**

The proposed motion acknowledges receipt of the final report and recommendations of the King County Charter Review Commission and thanks the commission members for their outstanding service to the citizens of King County. A copy of the motion is Attachment 1 to this staff report.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The King County Charter provides that at least every 10 years a citizen commission shall be formed to review the Charter and present to the Council "a written report recommending those amendments, if any, which should be made to the charter." (Charter § 800)

The 2007-2008 King County Charter Review Commission ("CRC") held its first meeting on 27 February 2007 and during the next five months conducted an extensive public outreach campaign, inviting hundreds of groups and individuals to provide input on whether there was a need for the Charter to be amended. Besides its own five meetings during this period, the CRC held nine public hearings, one in each Council district. This public outreach campaign elicited more than 350 proposals for charter amendments (some of which were overlapping) from more than 100 groups and individuals.

In September of 2007 the CRC formed four subcommittees to review the 350 charter amendment proposals and winnow them down to a realistic number of proposed amendments to recommend for consideration by the full commission. The four subcommittees were:

- Governmental Structure Subcommittee
- Regional Governance Subcommittee
- Rural-Local Subcommittee
- Ad Hoc and Technical Committee

The subcommittees met regularly from September of 2007 through February of 2008 and forwarded their recommendations to the full commission, which also continued to meet during this period. In February and March, the full commission considered and voted on the subcommittee recommendations and issued a draft report, which was published for public comment. Following the three-week public comment period in April, the commission met twice

more, on April 22 and 29, to consider the comments that it had received and to modify the proposed amendments as it deemed appropriate. (The charter review timeline is described in Attachment 2.)

On Friday, May 30, the CRC transmitted its final report and recommendations to the Council for consideration pursuant to Charter section 800.

Together, the commission and its subcommittees met more than 40 times, with each meeting lasting from two to three hours, and held 13 public forums, including at least one in every council district. Throughout the charter review process, the commission received indispensable assistance from commission staff and from attorneys of the Prosecuting Attorney's Office.

Although the CRC members were a diverse group with strongly-held individual views, the meetings of the commission and its subcommittees were a model of civility and collaboration. The commission's final report contains only two minority reports, and most of the positions taken by the commission were unanimous.

#### THE CRC RECOMMENDATIONS

The CRC has recommended 12 charter amendments for the Council's consideration. Ten are substantive; two are technical. They are summarized on pages 6-7 of the CRC's final report, which is being provided separately to councilmembers, and are described in detail on pages 15-23 of the report.

The CRC recommends that six of the 12 proposed amendments be placed on the ballot this year, and three each in 2009 and 2010. That recommendation is detailed on page 14 of the CRC's report.

1 A MOTION acknowledging receipt of the final report and 2 recommendations of the King County Charter review 3 commission and thanking the commission members for their outstanding service to the citizens of King County. 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the King County Charter is the county's constitution and the 7 cornerstone of King County government, and 8 WHEREAS, the King County Charter has served King County well during the 9 almost forty years since the charter was originally approved by the voters, and 10 WHEREAS, in order to keep the charter well-tuned to meet the needs of King 11 County, the charter provides for a citizen commission to be assembled every ten years to 12 review the charter and recommend for consideration by the metropolitan King County 13 council any charter amendments that the commission deems necessary, and 14 WHEREAS, the 2007-2008 King County Charter review commission held its first 15 meeting on February 27, 2007, and since then has met, either as a full commission or in 16 one of four subcommittees, more than forty times and held thirteen public forums, 17 including at least one in every council district, and

19	submissions from well over one hundred persons and organizations regarding more than
20	three hundred fifty suggestions for charter amendments, and
21	WHEREAS, the commission has carefully considered all the suggested charter
22	amendments and has recommended a list of amendments for consideration by the

24	WHEREAS, the commission members are a diverse group, representing a variety
25	of backgrounds, professions and opinions and including at least one representative from
26	every council district, and
27	WHEREAS, the commission members have served as unpaid volunteers whose
28	work on the charter review commission has been in addition to their professional and
29	personal responsibilities, and
30	WHEREAS, despite their other commitments, the commission members have
31	been tireless in their dedication to the performance of their duties under the charter, and
32	WHEREAS, the commission transmitted its final report and recommendations to
33	the metropolitan King County council on May 30, 2008, and
34	WHEREAS, in the exercise of the council's duty under the charter, the council
35	will carefully review and consider the commission's report and recommendations;
36	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
