6	SECTION	1. Ordinance 77	37, Section 2, as ame	nded, and K.C.C. 10.24.020 are
7	each hereby amen	ded as follows:		
8	A. The di	vision shall mainta	nin an updated compre	ehensive solid waste managemen
9	plan and shall pro	oose necessary pla	n revisions to the cou	ncil at least once every five years
10	in accordance with	ı RCW 70.95.110,	, as now enacted or he	ereafter amended.
11	B. The Ki	ng County solid w	vaste advisory commi	ttee shall review and comment
12	upon the proposed	plan prior to its s	ubmittal to the counci	l for adoption.
13	C. The int	erlocal forum shal	l have the following i	responsibilities:
14	1. Advise	e the King County	council and county e	xecutive and other jurisdictions
15	as appropriate on a	all policy aspects of	of solid waste manage	ment and planning, and consult
16	with and advise th	e King County sol	id waste division on t	echnical issues;

17	2. Review and comment on alternatives and recommendations for the county				
18	comprehensive solid waste management plan and facilitate approval of plan by each				
19	jurisdiction;				
20	3. Review proposed solid waste interlocal agreements between King County and				
21	cities for planning, recycling and waste stream control;				
22	4. Review disposal rate proposals;				
23	5. Review status reports on: waste stream reduction, recycling, energy and				
24	resource recovery; and solid waste operations with interjurisdictional impact;				
25	6. Promote information exchange and interaction between waste generators, local				
26	governments with collection authority, recyclers and county-planned and operated disposal				
27	system;				
28	7. Provide coordination opportunities between King County solid waste division,				
29	local governments, private operators and recyclers; and				
30	8. Aid cities in recognizing municipal solid waste responsibilities, including				
31	collection and recycling, and effectively carrying out those responsibilities.				
32	D. The council shall hold a public hearing on the draft plan and another public				
33	hearing on the final plan before adoption of the plan. Any city using county solid waste				
34	facilities shall be notified of these public hearings and shall be requested to comment on the				
35	plan.				
36	E. The division shall submit to the council by ((April 1)) May 1 of each year an				
37	annual report of its progress toward objectives identified in the plan.
