Assumptions:

- 1. A The petition has been filed requesting vacation of that portion of 68th Avenue NE.
- 2. The department of transportation notified the various utility companies serving the area and has been advised that easements were either obtained or are not required within the vacation area. The Northshore Utility District has obtained an easement over a portion of the vacation area.
- 3. The department of transportation records indicates that King County has not been maintaining 68th Avenue NE as petitioned. The records indicate that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition.
- 4. The department of transportation considers the subject portion of the right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
- 5. The right-of-way is classified as "C-Class" and, in accordance with King County Code 14.40.020, the compensation due King County is based on fifty percent of the assessed value of the subject right-of-way which was determined from records of the department of assessments. King County is in receipt of \$14,766.83 from the petitioner.
- 6. In accordance with King County Code 14.40.050, compensation for right-of-way classified as "C-Class" shall be credited to the parks, recreation and open space fund.
