1 A MOTION recognizing May 2009 as Arts Education 2 Month. 3 4 WHEREAS, King County comprises eighteen school districts, more than seven 5 hundred twenty-two schools and more than three hundred thousand students, and 6 WHEREAS, King County invests in arts and heritage education through 4Culture, 7 a public development corporation chartered by King County government to promote arts 8 and heritage programs for all King County residents and visitors, and 9 WHEREAS, the arts, including dance, music, theatre and visual arts, are defined 10 as a core content area in Washington state's definition of basic education and are 11 considered an essential component of the complete education that should be provided for 12 all students, and 13 WHEREAS, learning in and through the arts enables students to develop critical 14 thinking and problem solving skills, imagination and creativity, discipline, alternative

ways to communicate and express feelings and ideas and cross-cultural understanding,

supporting academic success across the curriculum as well as personal growth outside the

18	WHEREAS, imagination and creativity are increasingly understood as critical
19	capacities needed for success in life in the 21st century, and students learn these skills
20	through meaningful learning in the arts, and
21	WHEREAS, we applaud the efforts and dedication of educators and advocates
22	around the state, and we call for school and community leaders to continue to broaden
23	and strengthen their arts education focus in order to ensure equity of access to arts
24	learning for all students;
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
26	A. The King County council reaffirms the importance of the arts as an essential
27	part of a complete education for all students.
28	B. May 2009 is recognized as Arts Education Month in King County.
29	C. All communities are encouraged to celebrate the arts with meaningful
30	activities and programs for students, teachers and the public that demonstrate learning

and understanding in the arts, and all citizens are urged to become interested in and give full support to quality school arts programs for children and youth.
