1 AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2009-0284, VERSION 2

- 1. The service changes proposed for September 2009 and February 2010 include the reallocation of 139,100 Metro bus platform hours in response to the startup of Sound Transit's Central Link light rail.
- 2. For neighborhoods served by the new Central Link light rail line, these service changes will establish Metro Transit bus connections to Link light rail stations and adjacent transit centers. The reallocation of bus service also preserves bus service at local bus stops within the area served by Link light rail. At some local bus stops, service is preserved through Sound Transit Regional Express bus routes. The reallocation proposal was developed using extensive public outreach.
 - 3. Sound Transit 2, approved by the electorate in November 2008, approves the extension of the Central Link light rail line to the University of Washington in 2016; from the University of Washington to Northgate, Seattle to Bellevue and SeaTac to Highline Community College in 2020;

to Overlake Transit Center in 2021; and to Lynnwood (via Shoreline) and Redondo/Star Lake in 2023. When service to each of these extensions commences, Metro Transit is expected to submit for council approval a service change that reallocates bus service.

4. It is the council's intent that these future service changes will establish Metro Transit bus connections to Link light rail stations and adjacent transit centers. The council further intends that reallocation of bus service for these extensions will also preserve bus service at local bus stops within the areas served by Link light rail extensions. Development of these reallocation proposals will include an extensive public outreach process."

EFFECT: This amendment summarizes the process used to reallocate 139,100 Metro bus platform hours in response to the startup of Sound Transit's Central Link light rail and states that it is the Council's intent to use a similar process in response to the startup of future light rail extensions.
