SUMMARY

Proposed Motions 2009-0420 through 2009-0423 (Attachments 1 through 4, pp. 3-17 of these materials) would appoint committees to write the voters' pamphlet statements for and against proposed charter amendments that the Council either has voted to place on the November 2009 general election ballot or is scheduled to consider at its next meeting, on July 20.

As introduced, the motions have blanks for the names of the appointees, since the appointees have not yet been determined. It is expected that the motions will be voted out of committee without recommendation and that the names of the appointees will be inserted by amendment when the full Council takes up the motions.

BACKGROUND

The Council has placed on the November 2009 general election ballot three proposed charter amendments, and a fourth amendment has been reported out of committee with a Do Pass recommendation. The four proposed charter amendments are:

- Transitional provisions charter amendment (Ordinance 16484);
- Budget allotments charter amendment (Ordinance 16546);
- Commission procedures charter amendment (Ordinance 16547); and
- Open Space charter amendment (Proposed Ordinance 2009-0245; reported out of the Committee of the Whole on June 24 with a Do Pass recommendation; scheduled to be considered at the July 20 meeting of the full Council).

RCW 29A.32.280 (Attachment 5, p. 19 of these materials) provides that for each measure from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter approval of the measure and a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter rejection of the measure.

Proposed Motion 2009-0420 (Attachment 1, pp. 3-5 of these materials) would appoint pro-con committees for the Open Space Amendment (Proposed Ordinance 2009-0245) if the Council votes to place it on the ballot.

Proposed Motion 2009-0421 (Attachment 2, pp. 7-9 of these materials) would appoint committees for the commission procedures charter amendment (Ordinance 16547).

Proposed Motion 2009-0422 (Attachment 3, pp. 11-13) would appoint committees for the transitional provisions charter amendment (Ordinance 16484).

Proposed Motion 2009-0423 (Attachment 4, pp. 15-17 of these materials) would appoint committees for the budget allotments charter amendment (Ordinance 16546).

RCW 29A.32.280 Arguments advocating approval or disapproval — Preparation by committees.

For each measure from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall, not later than forty-five days before the publication of the pamphlet, formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voters' approval of the measure and shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voters' rejection of the measure. The authority shall appoint persons known to favor the measure to serve on the committee advocating approval and shall, whenever possible, appoint persons known to oppose the measure to serve on the committee advocating rejection. Each committee shall have not more than three members, however, a committee may seek the advice of any person or persons. If the legislative authority of a unit of local government fails to make such appointments by the prescribed deadline, the county auditor shall whenever possible make the appointments.
