<u>SUBJECT</u>: Proposed Motion authorizing the chair of the council to amend King County's contract with Michael Temple, extending the term from August 30, 2009, to August 31, 2010. This contract extension includes both the base services provided by Michael Temple, but also extends for the same period the services previously performed by the King County Government Relations Consultant. These services were amended on to the previous contract with Michael Temple.

**SUMMARY:** Michael Temple has represented King County beginning November 16, 1998, in a professional and successful manner. The Council approved a contract extension (Motion 2008-0374) with Michael Temple on July 28, 2008, for the period August 28, 2008, through August 29, 2009. The proposed amendment will extend the contract from August 30, 2009, to August 31, 2010. The total compensation for this contract extension is \$131,200.

Michael Temple is a full partner in the advocacy and the positive outcomes of the King County Legislative Team. King County's Legislative Strategies are benefited greatly by his personal access to key political leaders and stakeholders.

Michael Temple will continue to perform the advocacy responsibilities of monitoring actions by the state legislature and the state executive branch on all issues of concern to King County, and to be an advocate on the county's behalf on all issues, including, but not limited to, growth management, water and sewer, and threatened and endangered species.

In addition, he will take the primary advocacy lead on the issue previously performed by the King County Government Relations Consultant to include the following issues: human services, housing, public health, criminal justice, and other duties as necessary to accomplish the King County Agenda. Michael Temple has added Carey Morris to his team, concentrating on these issues.

This option allows the Council to achieve significant savings by holding the Government Relations Consultant position unfilled.

8	WHEREAS, the county is a subdivision of the state of Washington, and
9	WHEREAS, as a result, the county's services, operations and finances are to a
10	significant extent controlled by the laws of the state, and
11	WHEREAS, legislation passed by the Washington state Legislature often impacts
12	King County's services, operations and finances, and
13	WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the residents of King County to have
14	representation during the legislative session on a broad range of complex issues, and
15	WHEREAS, based on a multi-year (3 year) competitive procurement process
16	through issuance of a request for proposals (RFP) conducted in 2007, Michael E. Temple
17	was selected to represent King County with state government officials, and

WHEREAS, the term of King County's contract with Michael E. Temple was
extended on July 28, 2008, by Motion 12819, to include the period from August 28,
2008, to August 29, 2009. The contract was amended on January 12, 2009, by Motion
12910, to add additional services and compensation for the period January 15, 2009,
through June 15, 2009. The term of King County's contract with Michael Temple for
additional services was further amended on May 19, 2009, to extend the contract term for
additional services to August 29, 2009, and

WHEREAS, Michael Temple will continue to perform the advocacy responsibilities of monitoring actions by the state legislature and the state executive branch on all issues of concern to King County, and to be an advocate on the county's behalf on all issues, including, but not limited to, growth management, water and sewer, and threatened and endangered species. In addition, he will take the primary advocacy lead on the issues previously managed by the King County Government Relations Consultant, including: human services, housing, public health, criminal justice, and other duties as necessary to accomplish the King County Agenda;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The chair of the metropolitan King County council is authorized to enter into a contract amendment extending the term of the contract with Michael E. Temple for the services of monitoring actions by the state legislature and the state executive branch on all issues of concern to King County, and advocating on the county's behalf on all issues, including, but not limited to, human services, housing, public health, criminal justice, growth management, water and sewer and threatened and endangered species, for one

year, from August 30, 2009, through August 31, 2010, for an amount not to exceed

#### 2008 amendment:

o Amendment #1 - \$73,600 (year 2 of the contract )

#### 2009 amendments:

- o Amendment #2 \$24,000 (to expand contractor's scope of work during the 2009 Legislative Session from January 15 through June 15, 2009)
- Amendment #3 \$9,600 (extend services of the subcontractor from June 16, 2009 through August 29,2009 and Councilmember Constantine sent a letter Mr. Temple to allow him to hire a subcontractor)
- o Total amendment amount in 2009 for additional services: \$33,600

Note: Amendment #2 and #3 covers Jan 15 - August 29, 2009 with an average of \$4,800 per check cycle for expanded services.

- Extend duration of services to include <u>August 30,2009</u> through <u>August 31, 2010</u> The consultant shall be paid:
  - o Twelve equal monthly payments of \$10,933.33
  - o Total compensation for this amendment is \$131,200
- Grand Total contract amount (include 3 years of services from 2007-2010): \$308,400
