32	SECTION 3. Ordinance 10498, Section 25, and K.C.C. 6.64.450 are each hereby				
33	amended to read as follows:				
34	A. The taxicab vehicle owner shall notify the director within five working days				
35	whenever a taxicab is destroyed, rendered permanently inoperable, or is sold.				
36	B. A replacement vehicle must be placed in service within sixty days of the date				
37	the original vehicle is removed from	n service unless pri	or written permission has been		
38	obtained from the director. It is the	intent of this section	on that the director in granting such		
39	permission gives due consideration	to the operating sit	uation of the permit holder on a		

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40	case-by-case basis. The following guidelines are to be used in granting permission for a				
41	permit holder to take longer than sixty days in placing a replacement vehicle in service:				
42	1. The licensee must submit a written request for an extension of time, stating				
43	the specific reason additional time is required and identifying a plan and timetable for				
44	placing the replacement vehicle in service. Written documents sufficient to substantiate				
45	the factual information contained in the request should also be submitted;				
46	2. The plan and timetable submitted must reflect a reasonable approach for				
47	placing the vehicle in service within the shortest possible time frame;				
48	3. An additional period of time not to exceed sixty calendar days may be				
49	granted to a permit holder in case of severe personal illness or other similar hardship;				
50	4. An additional period of time not to exceed thirty calendar days may be				
51	granted to a licensee in case of extensive vehicle repairs or other similar reason;				
52	5. No extensions will be granted to any permit holder who is unable to meet the				
53	basic operational costs, including liability insurance, regulatory fees( $(5)$ ) and normal				
54	maintenance and repairs of operating a taxicab vehicle;				
55	6. No more than one extension in time will be granted for each vehicle permit				
56	during its license year (((September 1 through August 31))).				
57	C. When a permit holder permanently retires any taxicab vehicle from service				
58	and does not replace it within $((60))$ sixty days, the permit for each retired vehicle shall				
59	be considered abandoned and null and void. The permit holder shall immediately				
60	surrender each related taxicab plate to the director. Such abandoned permits may not be				
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62 restored or transferred by any means.

SECTION 4. This ordinance takes effect January 1, 2010. 63
