1) Grants to Farmers markets for compliance with new Public Health – Seattle & King County permitting requirements to develop and implement COVID-19 operating plans and prepare weekly compliance reports. Based on preliminary outreach, grants awards of \$10,000 would allow the farmer's markets to make progress on these plans.

2) Grants to local farm businesses to cover the added cost of procuring the necessary health and safety PPE for farmers and farm workers, and implementing new standards and practices in one-time payments of \$1,000.

3) Grants to local farm businesses and organizations to support transitioning to ecommerce platforms, and the professional support needed for an online sales plan and to build a technology platform and select online financial payment systems. Grants between \$2,500-\$5,000 would make support this transition, and would likely be administered in coordination with an external partner.
4) Support for farm to foodbank/food pantry efforts could provide much needed revenue for local farmers while increasing the amount, variety, quality, and consistency of local produce made available to food-insecure King County residents. Farmers lost market share and sales due to restaurant closures and Farmer's Markets not operating at full capacity and need new sales channels. Food banks are experiencing unprecedented growth in clients at a time when there is limited supply of fresh products and a decline in food donations. Grants will be awarded to foodbanks/food pantries to purchase farm produce will provide revenue to farmers and provide food banks/pantries with fresh produce for food insecure residents.

5) Help meet the increased need for nutritious food by providing grant dollars to community organizations, and helping connect them with farmers in order to bring farm-fresh food to senior centers.

6) A half-time grant manager (or something similar) is needed to support these programs. Wages and benefits have been included as a placeholder.
