1	AN ORDINANCE rela	ting to solid waste financing of
2	projects in the landfill reserve fund; and amending	
3	Ordinance 12076, Section 13, as amended, and	
4	K.C.C.4A.200.390.	
5	STATEMENT OF FACTS:	
6	1. The solid waste division of	the department of natural resources and
7	parks provides essential public	services that protect human health, the
8	environment and the quality of	life in our region.
9	2. The solid waste division op-	erates the Cedar Hills regional landfill,
10	eight transfer stations and two	drop boxes. It also provides innovative
11	programs to help customers pro	event and recycle waste.
12	3. Until now, projects in the la	ndfill reserve fund were paid for entirely
13	using cash proceeds, which cre	ated large variations in the amount of cash
14	required to adequately maintain	and develop Cedar Hills Regional
15	Landfill.	
16	4. Using bond proceeds, as we	ll as cash, to finance projects in the Landfill
17	Reserve Fund will smooth the	effect those projects have on the rate while
18	supporting financial practices of	consistent with the King County
19	Comprehensive Financial Man	agement Policies.

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20	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:	
21	SECTION 1. Ordinance 12076, Section 13, as amended, and K.C.C.4A.200.390	
22	are hereby amended as follows:	
23	A. There is hereby created a landfill reserve fund.	
24	B. The fund shall be a first tier fund. It is an enterprise capital fund.	
25	C. The director of the department of natural resources and parks shall be the	
26	manager of the fund.	
27	D.1. The executive's proposed ((annual)) biennial budget shall specify a per-ton	
28	amount, included within the solid waste disposal fees approved by council, that shall be	
29	used to provide revenue for projects budgeted in the landfill reserve fund and an	
30	associated transfer from the solid waste fund to the landfill reserve fund. ((The transfers	
31	to and from the landfill reserve fund should occur monthly.))	
32	2. All proceeds from bonds issued for projects budgeted in the landfill reserve	
33	fund shall be deposited in the fund.	
34	E. All moneys deposited into the landfill reserve fund in accordance with this	
35	section shall be appropriated and used only for the management and replacement of King	
36	County landfills as follows:	
37	1. Landfill closure and site restoration, including design work((-));	
38	2. Reserve moneys for postclosure maintenance including, but not limited to,	
39	environmental monitoring, leachate pretreatment, gas extraction and site	
40	maintenance((-));	
41	3. Facility relocation of existing support facilities as existing landfill disposal	
42	areas are closed and new areas developed, including design work(($-$));	

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- 43 4. New area development to provide new disposal areas within a landfill,
- 44 including design work((-)); and
- 45 5. Facilities or programs to improve, replace or extend the life of system capital
- 46 facilities or to acquire landfill space outside of the county.
