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


Burien Transit Center

Benefits to the Community

- Increases park-and-ride capacity by 169 stalls
- Reduces land area devoted to auto uses
- Improves safety and access to transit for pedestrians and bicycles
- Provides site for future affordable housing
- Enables increased densities to meet employment and population targets





Project Benefits

- Expands access to regional transportation system by adding parking capacity (currently at 92% utilization)
- \succ Improves traffic conditions in the regional growth center by changing traffic patterns
- \geq Facility design supports multiple modes, including transit, walking and bicycling
- Project will be located next to transit, retail, housing, and civic amenities
- \succ Meets goals outlined in Burien Comprehensive Plan Policies, such as DB 1.25:
 - ... work with King County Metro and Sound Transit to facilitate development of a mixed use project on the property that accommodates the short-term needs of both the Transit Center and Park & Ride functions...






