44	Of this appropriation, \$100,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the			
45	executive takes the necessary steps to bargain with labor concerning assignment of all			
46	animal cruelty investigation work to the sheriff's office and an outcome of the bargaining			
47	is reached. It is the desire of the council that animal cruelty investigation work be			
48	performed by law enforcement personnel. The executive shall undertake to begin these			
49	negotiations no later than March 31, 2009. The executive shall report to the council on			
50	the status and outcome of these negotiations and provide the necessary legislation, if any,			
51	to implement the outcome. The executive shall provide a monthly report to the council			
52	on the status of the negotiations.			
53	Twelve copies of the report must be filed with the clerk of the council, who shall			
54	retain the original and will forward copies to each councilmember and to the lead staff of			
55	the committee of the whole and the general government and labor relations committee, or			
56	their successors.			
57	P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:			
58	Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the			
59	records and licensing services division, working in conjunction with the facilities			
60	management division, submits to the council monthly status reports on all CIP Projects at			
61	the Animal Control Shelters at Kent and Crossroads. This restriction shall be reduced in			
62	four equal quarterly increments of \$12,500 upon receipt of the monthly reports for each			

63	quarter. The monthly reports shall include a summary and current status of the scope,		
64	schedule and budget for each CIP project. Status reports shall identify any significant		
65	deviations from planned project implementation and highlight any anticipated problems		
66	that might significantly impact project progress.		
67	The monthly CIP status reports must be filed in the form of 11 copies with the		
68	clerk of the council, who shall retain the original and will forward copies to each		
69	councilmember and to the lead staff of the budget and fiscal management committee, or

97	report to the council on the status of and outcome of these negotiations and provide the

343	None of the funds appropriated for Renton Maintenance Fund Capital
344	Improvement Projects South Regional Maintenance Facility (CIP Project number
345	300808) or Property Sale Transaction Costs (CIP Project number 700209) may be
346	expended or encumbered until the council has approved a purchase and sale agreement of
347	the county-owned property known as the Summit Pit regional roads maintenance facility.
348	P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
349	Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall not be expended until two reports on the
350	status of the emergency radio replacement project (CIP Project number 347301) have
351	been transmitted to council. It is the intent of the council that progress reports for
352	emergency radio replacement project shall be transmitted to the council twice annually.
353	The progress reports shall describe all of the project activities undertaken during the
354	reporting period. The first progress report shall be due April 1, 2009, and also shall
355	include an inventory of county owned hand held radios, a report on the number of new
356	radios needed to serve the new sound transit service contracts and a report on how the

367	the business case and a proposed motion in the form of 12 copies with the clerk of the
368	council, who shall retain the original and will forward copies to each councilmember and
369	to the lead staff for the general government and labor relations committee and the law,
370	justice and human services committee, or their successors.
371	P4 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
372	Of this appropriation, no amount may be encumbered nor expended toward the
373	interim loan program, described in the executive's 2009 proposed budget under CIP
374	Project number 322801, until the council approves by motion a report that specifies the
375	components, requirements, processes, oversight and reporting of an interim loan program
376	that would be administered by King County. The executive, in collaboration with the
377	mental illness and drug dependency oversight committee, with assistance from council
378	staff and the office of the prosecuting attorney, shall develop this report.
379	This report is due to the council on April 1, 2009. Eleven copies of the report
380	must be filed with the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original and will forward

413	P8 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
414	It is the intent of the council that the conservation futures oversight committee,
415	when prioritizing new projects for approval, give highest priority to projects within
416	council districts in which disappropriations occurred to support project 315173, Raging
417	river headwaters.
418	P9 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
419	It is the intent of the council that previous appropriations for CFT projects to
420	acquire the BNSF Eastside Rail Corridor remain committed for this purpose.
421	P10 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
422	Of this appropriation, project 315173, Raging river headwaters, no more than
423	\$1,000,000 may be expended from funds derived from interfund borrowing and no more
424	than \$600,000 may be expended from funds derived from project 369002, TDR bank.
425	P11 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

426	It is the intent of the county that when prioritizing parks capital projects, highest
427	priority will be given to project 358104, east lake Sammamish regional, which is
428	disappropriated to support project 315173, Raging river headwaters.
429	P12 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
430	Of the appropriation for project 3771xx, CCD management system upgrade/
431	maintenance, \$306,370 shall be expended to secure the repurposed roster management
432	system and to maintain data systems currently in use by the division. Additionally, by
433	March 2010, the executive shall provide an estimate of the cost and needs for the
434	community corrections division management systems inclusion into the greater
435	department of adult and juvenile detention five-year information technology strategic
