1 **AMENDMENT TO STRIKING AMENDMENT S1 TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE**

2 **2021-0238, VERSION 1**

3 On page 22, after line 484 insert:

4 "SECTION 8. Ordinance 19210, Section 43, as amended, is hereby amended as
5 follows:

6 **GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND**

7 **HUMAN SERVICES** - From the general fund there is hereby disappropriated from:

8 General fund transfer to department of community and

9 human services (\$5,000,000)

10 SECTION 9. The council directs that section 8 of this ordinance takes effect

11 before section 10 of this ordinance.

12 SECTION 10. Ordinance 19210, Section 43, as amended, is hereby amended as

13 follows:

14 **GENERAL FUND TRANSFER TO DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND**

15 **HUMAN SERVICES** - From the general fund there is hereby appropriated to:

16 General fund transfer to department of community and

17 human services \$16,175,000

18 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

19 Of this appropriation, \$450,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
20 contract with the organizations selected by council districts.

21 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

22 Of this appropriation, \$1,500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for a
23 community-based organization capacity building program, which shall include sufficient
24 funding for capacity building for community-based organizations involved in work
25 related to the restorative community pathways diversion program. Capacity-building
26 efforts shall include increasing a community-based organization's geographic reach
27 directly or indirectly through partnerships with other community-based organizations and
28 increasing a community-based organization's internal capacity and expertise.

29 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

30 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
31 with the Auburn Valley YMCA to provide community services and recreational
32 equipment for youths and seniors.

33 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

34 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
35 with Book-It Repertory Theatre.

36 ER5 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

37 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
38 with the Center for Human Services.

39 ER6 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

40 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
41 with the city of Renton to support programs within the Renton community.

42 ER7 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

43 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
44 with the city of Bellevue to support the Friends of Bellevue Cross-Cultural Center
45 Project.

46 ER8 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

47 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
48 with the Federal Way and Auburn Boys and Girls Club to purchase sporting equipment or
49 pay recreation or leasing fees for youth in-need in the Auburn and Federal Way School
50 districts.

51 ER9 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

52 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
53 with the Federal Way Performing Arts and Event Center to support arts and cultural
54 programs and operations during and after the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic.

55 ER10 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

56 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
57 with the Mt. Si Senior Center to support the Far East Senior Hub.

58 ER11 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

59 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
60 with Open Doors for Multicultural Families to support community engagement and
61 concept development for a community center for individuals with disabilities.

62 ER12 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

63 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
64 with the Rainier Beach Action Coalition.

65 ER13 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

66 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
67 with the Seattle Children's Theatre.

68 ER14 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

69 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
70 with the Seattle Fishermen's Memorial.

71 ER15 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

72 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
73 with Seattle Shakespeare Company.

74 ER16 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

75 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
76 with the Seattle Sports Commission for outreach and bidding on regional, national and
77 international sporting events to be held in King County.

78 ER17 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

79 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
80 with the Three Rivers Chapter of Trout Unlimited for a milfoil removal pilot project in
81 Lake Sammamish.

82 ER18 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

83 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
84 with Urban Family Center Association.

85 ER19 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

86 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to contract
87 with the White Center Community Development Association.

88 ER20 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

89 Of this appropriation, \$5,000,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or
90 encumbered solely to contract with charitable, nonprofit organizations to provide
91 financial assistance to eligible clients applying for immigration relief, as well as a
92 contracted nonprofit organization's costs to administer and advertise the assistance. The
93 assistance shall be in the form of defraying the fees associated with the eligible client's
94 immigration relief process. For the purposes of this expenditure restriction, "eligible
95 client" means a person, including a person who is not eligible for federal or state benefits
96 because of the person's immigration status: (1) whose household income, excluding any
97 asset limit program requirements, would qualify the person to receive one of the
98 following types of state-administered public assistance: temporary assistance for needy
99 families, aged, blind or disabled assistance benefits, medical care services, pregnant
100 women assistance benefits, poverty-related veterans' benefits, food stamps or food stamp
101 benefits transferred electronically, refugee resettlement benefits, Medicaid or
102 supplemental security income; and (2) who resides, works or attends school in King
103 County or is currently detained but immediately before the detention resided, worked or
104 attended school in King County. The financial assistance supported by this appropriation
105 shall not exceed \$3,000 per eligible client or \$6,000 per eligible client's household.

106 ER21 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

107 Of this appropriation, \$11,175,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or
108 encumbered solely for a program to provide direct financial assistance to persons who
109 have experienced adverse economic impacts caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and are
110 not eligible for federal COVID-19 related assistance due to the persons' immigration

111 status."

112 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any internal references

113 accordingly.

115 On page 23, after line 505 insert:

116 "ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

117 Of this appropriation, \$7,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
118 support a child care assistance program to provide vouchers for families that are facing
119 financial hardships due to the COVID-19 pandemic. At least \$1,000,000 of the
120 appropriation encumbered in this Expenditure Restriction ER2 shall be expended or
121 encumbered solely to provide child care vouchers for applicants who live or work in rural
122 areas of King County.

123 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

124 Of this appropriation, \$400,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
125 contract with organizations to deliver diapers throughout the county for families that are
126 facing financial hardships due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

127 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

128 Of this appropriation, \$1,500,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
129 contract with organizations that provide support to individuals and their families
130 experiencing domestic violence, sexual violence and gender-based violence, which have
131 increased due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

132 ER5 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

133 Of this appropriation, \$480,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to

134 contract with a law school in the city of Seattle to provide no-cost legal services to county
135 residents for educational purposes, including, but not limited to, assist in filing domestic
136 violence protection orders, which have increased due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

137 ER6 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

138 Of this appropriation, \$11,175,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or
139 encumbered solely for a program to provide direct financial assistance to persons who
140 have experienced adverse economic impacts caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and are
141 not eligible for federal COVID-19 related assistance due to the persons' immigration
142 status.

143 P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

144 Of this appropriation, \$50,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
145 executive transmits a report on the status and results of the department of community and
146 human service's procurement process for community services to support secure detention
147 diversion for the city of Seattle and a motion to acknowledge receipt of the report, and a
148 motion acknowledging receipt of the report is passed by the council. The motion should
149 reference the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance number, ordinance section and
150 proviso number in both the title and body of the motion.

151 The report shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

152 A. A description of the how the department consulted with the King County
153 council, Seattle Mayor's Office, Seattle City Council and representatives of the
154 community and other groups to develop the investment approaches to support diversion
155 and decrease the use of secure detention, including a listing of all of the groups
156 participating in the planning process;

157 B. Copies of the request for proposals for the procurement process;
158 C. A listing of all respondents to the procurement process; and
159 D. A listing of all those who received contracts under the procurement process,
160 showing: (1) the contract amount awarded for each contract; (2) the contract period for
161 each contract; (3) a description of the services that each contractor will provide; (4) the
162 proposed populations and services area for each contract; (5) the performance metrics in
163 each contract; and (6) a description of how the contractor's services will divert
164 individuals from the criminal-legal system and secure detention.

165 The report required by this proviso should be completed within ninety days from
166 the date of the department's final contract award notification but no later ninety days from
167 September 30, 2021.

168 The executive should file the report on the department's procurement process for
169 community services to support secure detention diversion for the city of Seattle and the
170 motion required by this proviso in electronic format with the clerk of the council, who
171 shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council
172 chief of staff and the lead staff for the law and justice committee, or its successor."

182 "ER26 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:
183 Of this appropriation, \$5,000,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or
184 encumbered solely to contract with charitable, nonprofit organizations to provide
185 financial assistance to eligible clients applying for immigration relief, as well as a
186 contracted nonprofit organization's costs to administer and advertise the assistance. The
187 assistance shall be in the form of defraying the fees associated with the eligible client's
188 immigration relief process. For the purposes of this expenditure restriction, "eligible
189 client" means a person, including a person who is not eligible for federal or state benefits
190 because of the person's immigration status: (1) whose household income, excluding any
191 asset limit program requirements, would qualify the person to receive one of the

205 *eligible for federal COVID-19 related assistance due to their immigration status.*
