# Presentation of a Proclamation of October 2010 as Filipino American History Month in King County

Mr. Gossett made comments regarding Filipino American History Month. He asked the following leaders in the Filipino community to join him at the podium:

Brandon Braun, Filipino Lawyers of Washington, Fred and Dorothy Cordova, co-founders and co-directors of the Filipino American National Historical Society, Ray

Pascua, president of the Filipino American Community of Yakima and member of the Washington State Commission of Asian Pacific American Affairs and Velma Veloria, the first Filipino American elected to the State Legislature, mainland, US. Mr. Gossett read the proclamation.

Mr. Pascua made remarks, indicating that he was the author of the resolutions that were passed unanimously by houses of the Washington State Legislature on March 3, 2010. He commented that the earliest documented proof of Filipino presence in the continental United States was on October 18, 1587, this being the 423rd anniversary. He presented a copy of the resolutions as well as documents from Governor Chris Gregoire and Mayor Mike McGinn to Mr. Gossett and the King County Council.

Mr. Braun, Ms. Veloria and Mr. Cordova thanked the Council. Mr. Gossett presented the Council's proclamation.

#### 9. Proposed Ordinance No. 2010-0525

AN ORDINANCE relating to contracting indebtedness; providing for the issuance and sale of one or more series of limited tax general obligation bonds and bond anticipation notes of the county in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$150,000,000 outstanding at any time, for the purpose of financing the Capital Improvement Program for Solid Waste Facilities and the Solid Waste Transfer and Waste Management Plan; providing for the form, terms, covenants and other provisions of the bonds and notes; providing for sale of the bonds and notes and the disposition of the proceeds of sale; establishing funds for the receipt and expenditure of bond and note proceeds and for the payment of the bonds and notes; providing for the annual budgeting and levy of taxes to pay the principal thereof and interest thereon.

Mr. Phillips reported on the Sound Transit Capital Committee. The committee had an update from the Martin Luther King Jr. Way South Noise Mitigation committee. Mr. Phillips indicated there were a number of noise complaints in the Rainier Valley and Tukwila regions. The committee indicated that substantial work has been completed in compliance with federal regulations. The agency is committed to continue to work to reduce those noise levels. The agency will provide an update on a quarterly basis.

The committee also had a report on the First Hill link connector, the new trolley that will be along Broadway. The project is moving forward.

Mr. Phillips also spoke about the light rail system project in the University District.
