AN ORDINANCE approving and adopting the collective bargaining agreement negotiated by and between King County and International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local 117 (Administrator I - Transit) representing employees in the department of transportation, transit division; and establishing the effective date of said agreement.

12. Proposed Ordinance No. 2011-0248

AN ORDINANCE relating to solid waste interlocal agreements; authorizing the executive to enter into an amendment to the 1988 solid waste interlocal agreement with the city of Bothell extending the term of that agreement from 2028 to 2057 and an interlocal with Snohomish county related to solid waste management services in areas of Snohomish county annexed to the city of Bothell after January 1, 2011.

13. <u>Proposed Ordinance No. 2011-0249</u>

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the King County executive to enter into an amended agreement with the Washington state Department of Ecology for additional loan financing for construction costs of the Ballard Siphon project.

15. Proposed Motion No. 2011-0245

A MOTION confirming the executive's appointment of Lorelea Hudson, who resides in council district four, to the King County landmarks commission, to fill the archaeologist position.

This matter had its first reading and was referred to the Transportation, Economy and Environment Committee.

16. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

Ms. Patterson reported on the Sound Transit Board meeting. The Board was briefed on the results of the south corridor realignment work plan. The Board directed staff to conduct a transit alternative study of the Federal Way Tacoma corridor. This study will look at differences in ridership for regional bus versus light rail and different details associated with different modes. The Board expects a final Environmental Impact Statement to be completed this summer for east link, and once completed the Board will make a final decision on the east link alignment, hoping that the city of Bellevue will move cooperatively forward in the funding, potentially for a tunnel. Ms. Patterson also commented on the new fares for Sound Transit Express busses . She gave the web site for information: www.soundtransit.org. Mr. Phillips made comments about the Sound Transit Board meeting, indicating the importance to express the feeling of the Board on their views.

Mr. Phillips briefed the Council on the Cedar River Council and the health of the cedar river system. He indicated that Water and Land Resources has done extensive work. The council had a presentation regarding what will be in the future regarding a natural system.

Other Business

17. <u>Executive Session - Chief of Staff Interviews</u>

The Chair recessed the meeting into Executive Session under RCW 42.30. 110 at 2:57 p.m., to evaluate the qualifications of applicants for public employment. The Chair resumed the meeting at 4:21 p.m.
