21. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the Sound Transit board meeting. She indicated the members focused on a decision regarding the east link light rail alignment within the city of Bellevue. For the past two months, the Bellevue City Council and the Sound Transit Board have been working on a memorandum of understanding on how to fund light rail through downtown Bellevue. The Sound Transit Board of Directors agreed to work with the city to find additional funding to build a tunnel, which was not approved by the voters, and which is estimated to cost an additional \$276 million beyond the cost of an at-grade alignment. Ms. Patterson indicated that the Mayor of Bellevue presented to the Board a letter stating Bellevue's commitment to take action on the memorandum of understanding before November 14.

Ms. Lambert reported on the King County Strategic Advisory Committee meeting. The members discussed how important e-government is and how fast it will be growing in the years ahead. She indicated that citizens are very interested in what they can do on the internet. She also indicated that the Assessors Office has done an excellent job of reducing costs, by using e-government.

Other Business

Mr. Phillips informed the members that the public hearing on Proposed Substitute Ordinance 2011-0227 has been deferred until December 5, 2011, in order for staff to continue its review of the ordinance.
