The meerting was recessed at 9:27 a.m. The meeting was reconvened at 10:19 a.m.

5. Proposed Ordinance No. 2013-0212

AN ORDINANCE relating to the creation of a department of public defense, amending Section 350.20 of the King County Charter adding a new Section 350.20.60 entitled "Duties of the Department of Public Defense" to the King County Charter creating a department of public defense and an appointed office with the title of "county public defender," adding a new Section 350.20.61 to the King County Charter, adding a new Section 350.20.65 to the King County Charter creating a public defense advisory board, adding a new Section 555 to the King County Charter, permitting the county to contract for public defense services, adding a new Section 899 to the King County Charter, requiring the executive to consult with the county public defender on the executive's bargaining with employees of the department of public defense, submitting the same to the voters of the county for their ratification or rejection at the November 2013 general election.

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Chair Patterson offered opening remarks.

Patrick Hamacher, Council Staff, briefed the committee on both Proposed Ordinance 2013-0212 and Proposed Ordinance 2013-0242 and answered questions from the members

Jim Brewer, Council Legal Counsel, answered questions from the members. Joe Woods. Executive Office, offered comments.

Councilmember Lambert moved Proposed Ordinance 2013-0212.
Councilmember Lambert moved Striking Amendment S2 to Proposed Ordinance 2013-0212.

Councilmember Dembowski moved Amendment 2 to Striking Amendment S2. Mr. Dembowski offered additional language on page 1 line 13 after "department" inserting "; however, the enactment of appropriation ordinances does not constitute interference." Councilmember Dembowski's Amendment 2, as amended, passed unanimously.

Councilmember Phillips withdrew Amendment 3 to Striking Amendment S2. He moved a friendly amendment to Striking Amendment S2 on page 3, line 50, after "board shall also advise the executive and council on matters of" and before "social justice" to insert "equity and ".

Ms. Lambert accepted the amendment as friendly. Voting on the motion to approve S2, as amended, was unanimous.

Councilmember Lambert moved Title Amendment T3. The motion passed unanimously.

Proposed Ordinance 2012-0212, as amended, was expedited to the July 1, 2013 King County Council meeting agenda.

A motion was made by Councilmember Lambert that this Ordinance be Recommended Do Pass Substitute. The motion carried by the following vote:

6. Proposed Ordinance No. 2013-0242

AN ORDINANCE implementing the charter amendment that was placed on the ballot by Ordinance 17614, contingent on certification that the charter amendment has been approved by the voters; amending Ordinance 8257, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.60.020, Ordinance 17588, Section 4, and K.C.C. 2.60.026, Ordinance 383, Section 5, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.60.050, Ordinance 11955, Section 12, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.100, Ordinance 11955, Section 13, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.110 and Ordinance 1872, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.32.100 and adding new sections to K.C.C. chapter 2.60.

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Chair Patterson announced that Striking Amendment S3 to Proposed Ordinance 2013-0242 would be distributed at the end of the meeting. There will be a sixty day comment period for the public to offer comments on this Striking Amendment.
