30. <u>Reports on Special and Outside Committees</u>

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Councilmember Lambert reported that Washington State Association of Counties heard a briefing on current bills in the Washington State Legislature, discussed Pierce County's experience being an early adopter of basic health care combined plan or Administrative Services Only (ASO), the Department of Ecology's Hirst implementation plan, and the Growth Management Plan study.

Councilmember Lambert also reported on the County Road Administration Board. She reported that since 2002 the amount of road monies received each year is down \$2,000.000.00. The Board also received a briefing on the state of bridges in Washington.

Councilmembers Kohl-Welles and Gossett reported on the Growth Management Planning Board's final approval of the Regional Centers Framework proposal before referring it to the Executive Board, and a briefing on Puget Sound Regional Council's draft Regional Open Space Conservation Plan. The Board also certified various comprehensive plans.
