2. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Ms. Lambert reported on the Governor's Task Force on Affordable Housing. She indicated that a number of meetings will be held with a report to the Governor by the end of November. People from all across the state were in attendance, discussing affordable places to live. Ms. Lambert shared some statistics, and indicated she will continue to monitor this issue.

Ms. Lambert briefed the Council on her participation at the Governor's Task Force on Oceans. The importance of oceans to our environment was discussed, and a good definition on ecosystems based management. The University of Washington has started a pilot project, called Neptune, to share more information and education.

Ms. Lambert reported on the Puget Sound Partnership and announced upcoming September 7 and 8 meetings. There will also be a meeting in October, with a final report in November.

Ms. Lambert commented on her visit to Skykomish and viewing their land clean up project. She said it was fascinating to see what has been done so far.

Mr. von Reichbauer commented on his enjoyment attending the outdoor Federal Way Symphony and the performance of Ernestine Anderson.
