Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:54 p.m.

1. Approval of Minutes of October 23, 2006

Mr. Gossett moved to approve the minutes of the October 23, 2006 meeting as presented. Seeing no objection, the Chair so ordered.

2. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Ms. Patterson reported on the Executive Board meeting of the Puget Sound Regional Council. She indicated the public had just been informed of the proposal to trade the BNSF corridor for Boeing Field, and there was a sense of enthusiasm that might work out. The Board approved the transportation improvement program which contains 122 projects that will receive \$502 million from the federal government. The Board also agreed it would continue to participate with the transportation partnership in their efforts to lobby the state legislature for transportation in our region.

Mr. Phillips reported on the October 26 meeting of the Sound Transit Board. He indicated Sound Transit is working on a draft known as the ST2 Plan hoping to approve a final by May or June, 2007. Voters will have the opportunity to approve the ST2 Plan in the fall, 2007. The Board heard a report from staff regarding public comment, and had a report from the Expert Review Panel. The Board discussed construction progress in Rainier Valley.

Mr. Constantine briefed the Council on the Cultural Development Authority Board, known as 4Culture. The Board discussed the \$2.9 million in hotel/motel tax funding.

Mr. Phillips reported on the Cedar River Council and the health of the Cedar River. The Council had an update from Seattle Public Utilities on the Cedar River water supply. The Council also had a report on the Taylor Creek restoration project. The next meeting is November 28.

Mr. von Reichbauer reported on his participation in the kick off ceremony of the 40th anniversary of

the Seattle SuperSonics.
