She indicated that the vast majority of the funds would go to the SR520 corridor and for enhanced ferry service, including improved passenger only service to Vashon Island. The Board also heard a report on the passenger only ferry study. The full report will be available this winter.

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the Sound Transit Board meeting. She commented on the purpose of the Expert Review Panel, which was put into place by the State of Washington, to provide a review of our system plan for Sound Transit. Ms. Patterson stated that the panel's report indicated that Sound Transit is moving forward appropriately.

Mr. Phillips also commented on the Expert Review Panel and indicated the Board had a briefing on the small business development program. He indicated the Board approved amendments to the agreement with the Burlington Northern Sante Fe Railway. Mr. Phillips announced that the downtown transit tunnel will reopen September 24.

Ms. Hague reported on the Eastside Transportation Partnership. The members had an update on the *I*-405 projects as well as a report on the SR520 mitigation panel. The members also discussed Lake Forest Park membership.
