1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:51 p.m.

2. Roll Call

5. Special Item

Presentation of a Proclamation Declaring October 2007 as Disability Awareness Month

Executive Sims joined the Chair at the podium. They read the proclamation declaring October 2007 as Disability Awareness Month. The Chair invited Tim Drangsholt, Manager, Safety and Claims, Human Resources, to give remarks. He acknowledged staff members who recruit people with disabilities. He introduced C.J. Sprague, Transfer Station Operations Supervisor, Department of Natural Resources and Parks, to speak about her personal journey.

6. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

Mr. Phillips reported on the Cedar River Council, reminding members that the Council's purpose is to monitor the health of the Cedar River. He indicated the Council heard a report on the water quality of the Cedar River, and that it was quite good. The Council also heard a report on river stabilization.

Mr. Phillips briefed the Council on the 4Culture Board meeting. The Board had a presentation on the cultural facilities recommendations in terms of small grants available to those arts organizations that need financial assistance for facility development.

Mr. Phillips reported on the Sound Transit Board meeting, indicating there was discussion on baselining the cost and schedule for the University link. The link is undergoing final design. The Board adopted a project budget for the University link, with a completion date in 2016.

Mr. Phillips indicated he and Ms. Patterson had the opportunity to attend the completion of the initial segment construction for the elevated portion of the guideway in Tukwila.

Ms. Patterson commented on this event.

Mr. von Reichbauer added that the Board elected Aaron Reardon, Snohomish County Executive, as Vice Chair.
