Mr. Herschensohn made remarks and introduced Leonard Garfield, Executive Director, Museum of History and Industry, and Jim Kelly, Executive Director, 4Culture.

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Ms. Patterson reported on Sound Transit. Light rail is coming to Tukwila during the month of July and then all the way to the airport during the month of December. The Board heard a report on Sound Transit's sustainability initiatives. Sound Transit is making great strides towards its sustainability goals and saving taxpayers a lot of money. The Board also heard a report from the Customer Service Director regarding the results from the customer service satisfaction survey. In all categories, except for one, customers are very happy with the service Sound Transit is providing. The one category indicated that customers want more service. The Board voted on a resolution to select a preferred implementation plan for Sound Transit's Phase Two funded bus service improvements. The plan is scheduled to be completed in February, 2011.
