1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:51 p.m.

2. Roll Call

3. Flag Salute and Pledge of Allegiance

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Ms. Hague led the flag salute and Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Approval of Minutes of September 14, 2009

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Mr. Ferguson moved to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2009 meeting as presented. Seeing no objection, the Chair so ordered.

5. Additions to the Council Agenda

Items 30 and 31 were added to the Council agenda.

6. Special Item

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Presentation of a Proclamation of September 26, 2009, as Harvest Celebration Day in King County, in conjunction with the 11th annual Harvest Celebration Farm Tour

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Mr. Constantine and Ms. Hague read and presented the proclamation. Matt Dunnahoe, King Conservation District, Karen Kinney, King County Agriculture Program, and Brad Gaolach, King County Extension, Washington State University, were in attendance to receive the recognition. Mr. Gaolach and Ms. Kinney thanked the Council.

7. Reports on Special and Outside Committees

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Mr. Phillips reported on the special meeting of Sound Transit. The members authorized the sale of bonds. Sound Transit is wrapping up its work with some significant capital projects. Sound Transit was able to sell the bonds at a lower rate than originally assumed.

Ms. Patterson reported on the South County Area Transportation Board. The Board discussed the 2040 Transportation Plan and all the preliminary alternatives that are being considered and had an update on different budget proposals from Metro and how the valley would respond from a transportation perspective. The next meeting will be devoted to preparing for a potential flood in South King County.

Ms. Patterson briefed the Council on the recent Board of Health meeting. The Board of Health is working very closely with the state and federal government to address the issue of swine flu. The Board passed a motion relating to who will receive the vaccine and how it will be distributed throughout King County. The Board also discussed Public Health's role regarding the possibility of flooding in the Green River Basin, and educating the public about health impacts of standing water. The Board also implemented fees for the small drinking water systems.
