The Board is in the process of updating the plan, and voted on an alternative that will give direction on how to move forward into the future. Three main issues were addressed: greenhouse gas emissions, congestion and funding that is sustainable to depend upon for transportation into the future.

Mr. Constantine reported on Sound Transit. The Board had a briefing on the engineering work that is being done on options to shorten the length of the downtown Bellevue tunnel. The Board authorized moving forward on the needed right of way purchases for the D to M alignment for

Sounder service through Tacoma.
