1. <u>Call to Order</u>

3. Approval of Minutes

5. <u>Metropolitan Water Pollution Abatement Advisory Committee</u> (MWPAAC) Report

John McClellan, Chair, Metropolitan Water Pollution Abatement Advisory Committee (MWPAAC), introduced himself and provided information about his background. He also reported that MWPAAC is interested and involved in the process of developing the 2023 sewer rate, the nutrients permit issue, and the RWQC work plan.

6. <u>Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) Report</u>

Kamuron Gurol, Director, Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD), gave a basic overview of WTD. He then provided a recap of the combined sewer overflow (CSO) events that occurred during January of this year. He also noted that King County filed an appeal and motion to stay the Nutrients General Permit. The county is currently in negotiations with the Department of Ecology concerning this issue. He also reported that WTD is in the first step in the process of establishing the 2023 sewer rate. And lastly, he described a grant opportunity for a pilot project for recycled water.
