AN ORDINANCE relating to traffic control, prohibiting parking during the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., school days only; and amending King County Ordinance 5292, schedule 16.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to the department of transportation road services division, traffic engineering section studies and as authorized by chapter 46.90 RCW, King County Ordinance 5292, schedule 16, which prohibits parking from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., school days only, along county roads, is amended to add the following roadways:

NE 178th Street, from 88th Avenue NE to 90th Avenue NE, north and south sides.

89th Court NE, from NE 178th Street to the end of the cul-de-sac, east, west and south sides.

SECTION 2. Signs posted to evidence the restriction described in section 1 of this ordinance shall be installed by the proper authority.
