AN ORDINANCE making a technical correction to the ordinance authorizing the use of a Revised Deed of and Agreement Relating to Development Rights in connection with the acquisition of development rights by the Farmland Preservation Program when utilizing federal Farm and Ranch Land Protection Program funding; and amending Ordinance 15221, Section 1.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

1. Ordinance 15221 contained a technical error wherein the last sentence did not making direct reference to the bond and federal program acquisition sources.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 15221, Section 1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The metropolitan King County council hereby authorizes the use of the Revised Deed of and Agreement

Relating to Development Rights, in substantially the form attached as Attachment A to this ordinance, for the acquisition of farmland development rights when Farm and Open Space Bonds initiative and Farm and Ranch Land Protection Program funding sources are utilized for the acquisition.
