WHEREAS, King County desires to work cooperatively with other local governments and other organizations to achieve its 2019 (FY 2020) federal legislative goals, and

WHEREAS, King County is dependent on a strong fiscal partnership with the federal government for addressing transportation and infrastructure, public health, affordable housing and homelessness, homeland security, flood control and other important needs, and

WHEREAS, the King County council and the King County executive will continue to review congressional developments for possible revisions of King County's 2019 (FY 2020) federal legislative goals;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
