



WHEREAS, King County must ensure that it is effective and efficient in providing alternatives to secure detention, and

WHEREAS, changes to the way in which community corrections alternatives are utilized may lead to better utilization of existing community corrections program capacity, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 15975, the 2008 King County Budget Ordinance, contains a proviso requiring the office of management and budget to work with representatives of the superior court, district court, office of the prosecuting attorney, office of the public defender, sheriff and the departments of adult and juvenile detention and community and human services, and review the current use of community corrections alternatives and programs and evaluate whether changes in screening, processing, sentencing or monitoring compliance could lead to better utilization of existing community corrections program capacity, and

WHEREAS, the executive has transmitted to the council with this motion, a report developed collaboratively with county criminal justice system partners, that details a review of the feasibility of implementing changes in how the county uses its community corrections program;
