AN ORDINANCE adopting and ratifying Growth Management Planning Council

Motion 20-1.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

#### **SECTION 1. Findings:**

- A. Growth Management Planning Council Motion 20-1 amends the Urban Growth Boundary map and the Potential Annexation Areas map in the 2012 King County Countywide Planning Policies to adjust the urban growth area boundary in three areas: Woodinville Roundabout; Maple Woods Subdivision; and East Cougar Mountain.
- B. On February 26, 2020, King County staff briefed the Growth Management Planning Council on the details of the potential changes to the urban growth area under consideration by the King County council.
  - C. On June 24, 2020, the Growth Management Planning Council unanimously adopted Motion 20-1.
