Ordinance 14971.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 14971 required the solid waste division to develop a business plan subsequent to completion of the Transfer System and Waste Management Plan, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 14971 required that the business plan address, at a minimum:

- 1. Emergency capacity;
- 2. System reliability;
- 3. Efforts to coordinate planning and operations with other jurisdictions;

- 4. Possible impacts of future system choices on employees;
- 5. Strategies to encourage competition;
- 6. Preserving service levels and value for customers;
- 7. Integration of waste export activities with transfer network;
- 8. Environmental protection; and
