A MOTION appointing committees to write the voters' pamphlet statements for and against the charter amendment placed on the ballot by Ordinance 16546 for the November 3, 2009, election.

WHEREAS, K.C.C. chapter 1.10 provides for the publication and distribution of local voters' pamphlets in conformity with the provisions of chapter 29A.32 RCW for annual general elections held in King County, and

WHEREAS, RCW 29A.32.280 provides that for each measure from a unit of local government that is included in a local voters' pamphlet, the legislative authority of that jurisdiction shall formally appoint a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter approval of the measure and a committee to prepare arguments advocating voter rejection of the measure, and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 16546, passed by the council on June 8, 2009, provided for submission to the voters at the November 3, 2009, general election, of the proposed repeal of Section 475 of the King County

Charter;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

Pursuant to RCW 29A.32.280, the following individuals are appointed to serve on the voters' pamphlet committees for the charter amendment proposed in Ordinance 16546, each committee to write a statement for or against the proposed amendment, for the 2009 general election:
